

Science & Technology Australia Membership Committee

Terms of Reference

- 1. The Membership Committee (the Committee) reports to the Executive Committee, and through it, the Board of STA.
- 2. The Committee shall:
 - a. Review STA's membership profile to consider how it is placed within the sector and ensure that it remains reflective of the sector's changing profile.
 - b. Consider the most appropriate membership type and cluster for STA members and potential members.
 - c. Within the framework of the membership strategy, identify potential new STA members, including introducing potential new members to the relevant cluster representative, CEO and/or other Board members.
 - d. Identify areas of science and technology which are under-represented on STA membership and identify potential new members in these areas as a priority.
 - e. Conduct a two-yearly review of membership structure and report to the Board the findings and recommendations of the review.
 - f. Bring matters relating to the membership to the attention of the Executive Committee as necessary.
- 3. The Committee is Chaired by a member of the Board. It may be co-Chaired by two Board members.
- 4. The Committee comprises five members who are broadly representative of STA membership, with particular attention to those areas of science and technology that are under-represented in STA membership. The Committee should take into account diversity of gender, geography, discipline and institution type. The President and CEO of STA are ex-officio members of this Committee.
- 5. Membership of the Committee will be for a two-year term; at least half of the Committee should turn over every year.
